We estimate that 300-400 000 tonnes of this food is in-date, fit for consumption surplus that could be re-distributed

We typically accept food which has low or even negative commercial value to the food industry partner

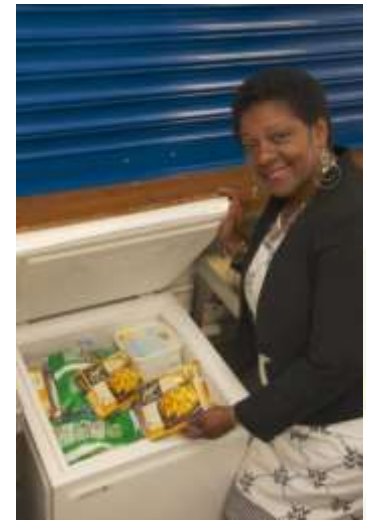

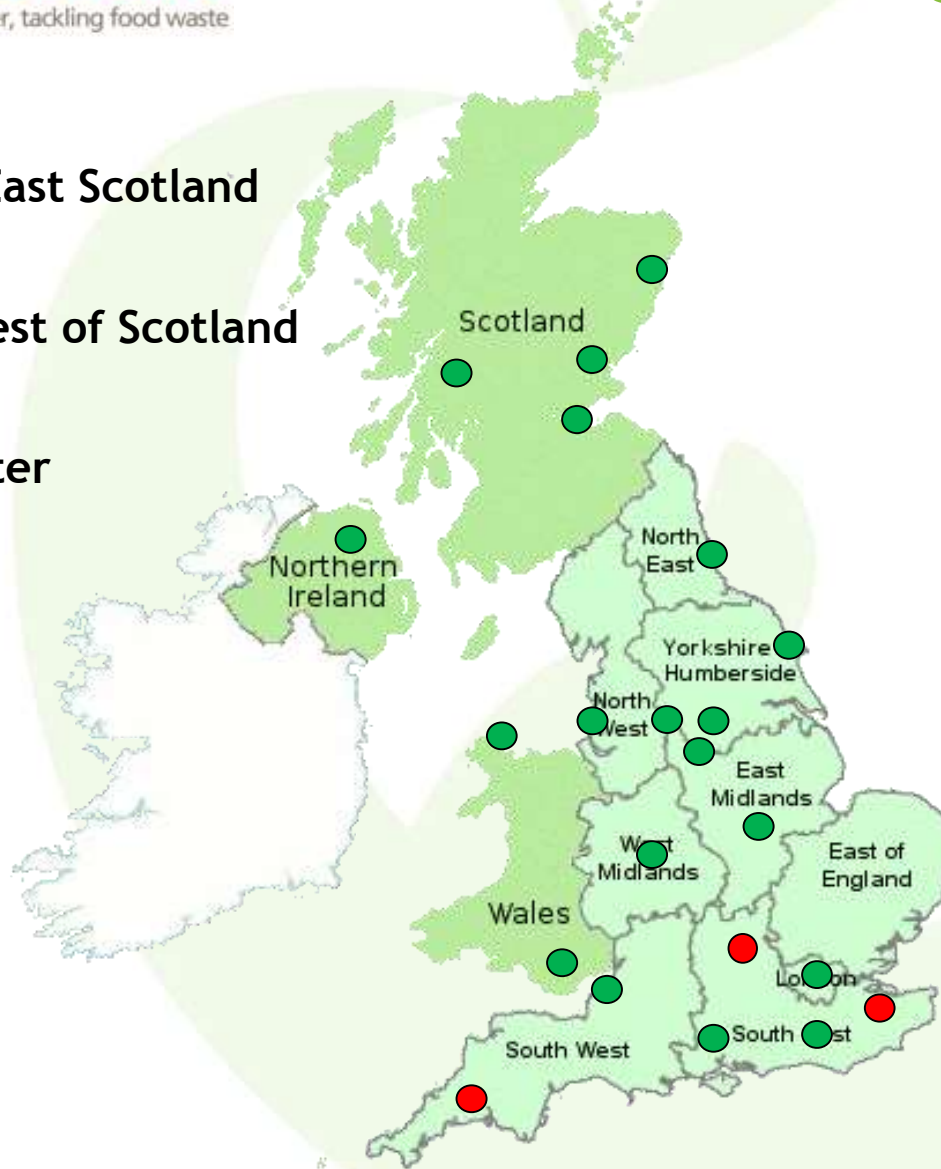
Essential service for charities

- We save each charity we work with an average of **£13,000** a year
- More than **80%** reinvest those savings into providing support services for their clients
- In 2012 **59%** had more people turning to them for food
- **70%** expect demand to increase in the future
- **42%** of them have faced funding cuts

At FareShare Regional Centres

- Every Depot follows strict compliance procedure
- All FareShare depot staff have: CIEH Level 3 Award in Food Safety
- All FareShare Depots externally audited (by NFS-CMi)
- All FareShare Processes and procedures comply with :

 - Food Hygiene Regulations Eng/Scotland 2006
 - Reg. EC852/2004 Hygiene of Food Stuffs

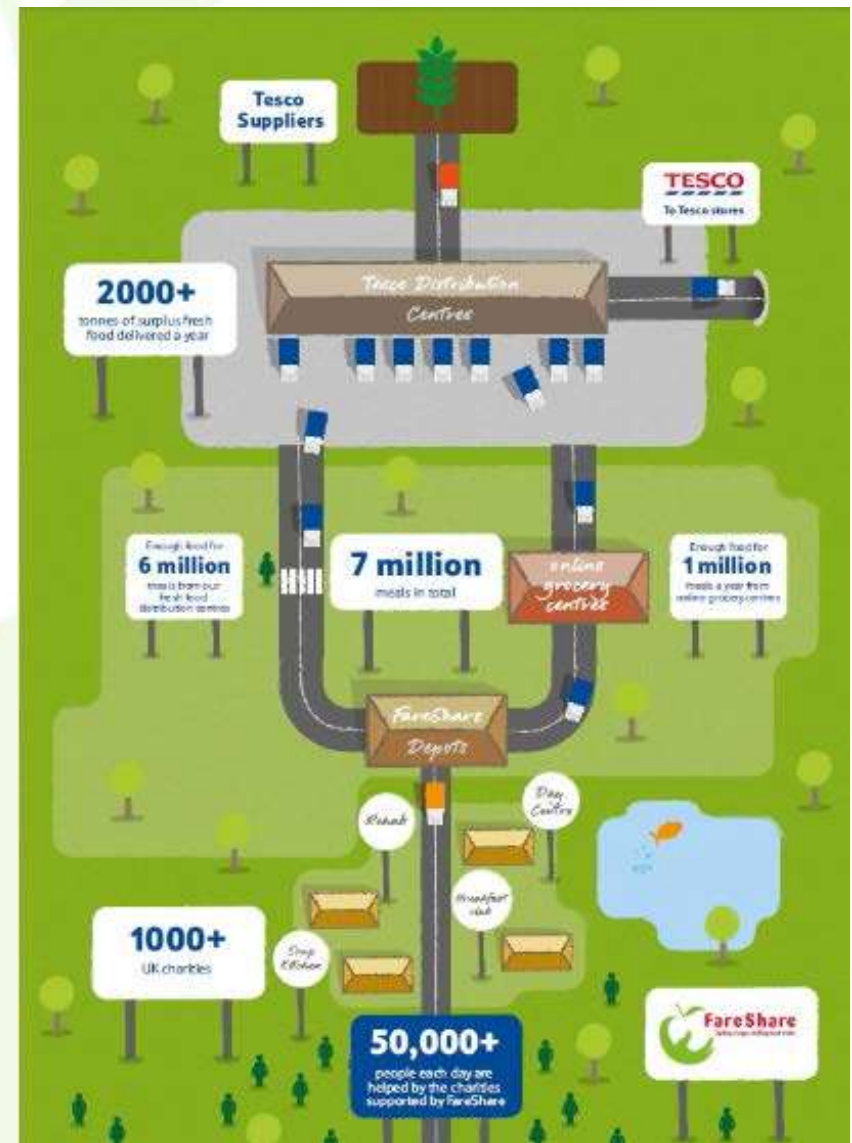
- Major initiative announced last year by Asda- commitment to provide chilled returns to FareShare
- Delivering to 17 FareShare Regional Centres around the country on a weekly basis
- Over 1 million meals in first year of initiative





- Surplus food from Tesco's chilled and online distribution centres is now diverted to FareShare.
- Extensive work to encourage suppliers to do the same

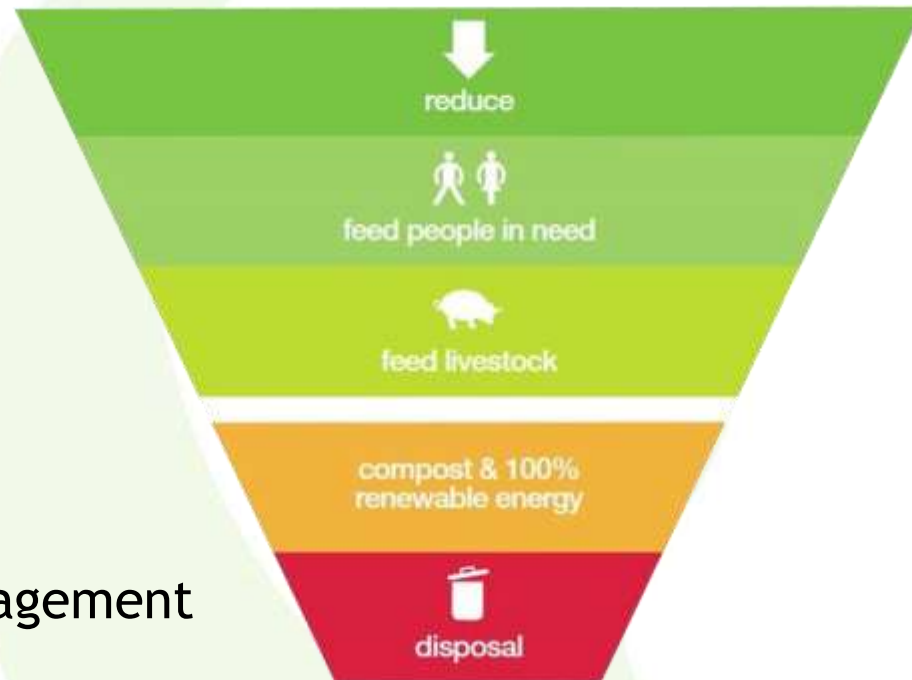
14. By 2020, we'll have worked with our own brand suppliers to reduce carbon emissions across all of our own brand products by 50 per cent relative
